While at SFU, Aidan completed the Cooperative Education Program and worked as a research assistant in health services and policy research, focusing on topics impacting population health equity. He recently published a paper documenting the nature of private payment for primary care in Canada and coauthored another paper examining primary care service use by income quintile in BC.
