


FIRST NATION CEMETERY 96 Avenue

R. E. G. Langton




Why IB?

- An enriched approach to education that challenges our students to immerse themselves in their learning
- Preparation for academic life after high school – we continually hear that our IB students are successful and ready for the realities of University
- The IB DP goes beyond academic learning, develops well-rounded students with creative and critical thinking skills, ethical decision-making and a passion for inquiry and learning.

MYP to DP Continuum

- Although there is no pre-requisite to study the DP, the IB's Middle Years Programme (MYP) does align closely with the DP, ensuring a smooth transition for students.
- MYP's focus on approaches to learning continues through to the DP.
- MYP prepares students for the DP by reflecting the depth, breadth and balance that is characteristic of all IB programmes.
- Students benefit from consistent and shared approaches to teaching of the MYP and DP.

Why IB?

- Community building – students and teachers spend their time constructively supporting each other and continuously learning - a “School within a School”
- Today’s world is increasingly global, and IB places developing an international perspective at its core
- Students are encouraged and expected to be active and engaged citizens - both locally and globally.

IB DP Curriculum Framework

- Students take 6 subject area courses along with the 3 Core over 2 years (nine total)
- Students need 3 Higher Level (HL) and 3 Standard Level (SL) courses
- The Core consists of:
 - Creativity, Action and Service (CAS)
 - Theory of Knowledge (TOK)
 - Extended Essay (EE)



HL vs. SL

- Higher Level courses require more instructional hours and generally cover more topics than Standard Level courses.
- The curriculum covered is not necessarily harder.




IB Core - Theory of Knowledge

- Dedicated course in student's schedule
- Explores how we know what we know - the nature of knowledge across disciplines
- Fosters a global perspective
- It demonstrates the ways in which the student can apply their knowledge with greater awareness and credibility



IB Core - Extended Essay

- Independent, self-directed piece of research ending with a 4,000 word paper
- Practical preparation for undergraduate research
- Highly supported by Garibaldi teachers and teacher-librarians
- Additional “points” for final Diploma
- 2025 Cohort EEs (password = “rebels”)



IB Extended Essay GSS Student Examples

Balancing Coexistence: How does economic activity affect the sustainability of the southern mountain caribou population residing in British Columbia?

Architecture and Apartheid: To what extent did architecture and urban design promote the ideals of Apartheid in South Africa?

IB Core - Creativity, Activity and Service

- Students make a plan in Grade 11 to incorporate all three components in their Grade 11 and 12 year
- CAS is not formally assessed but is a required component of the Diploma Programme
- Information and support for completing CAS is delivered during the TOK class

SSST - Language A Support - Ms. Elphick

- School-Supported Self-Taught
- Replaces French B for students whose mother-tongue is not English
- Allows students to earn Language A in their mother-tongue and a Bilingual Diploma
- With support from a teacher students access an online course that has their material in their home language

French Ab Initio

- Ab Initio is for students who have never studied French before. In timetable goal for 2025
- Replaces French B for students who may have studied a language we do not offer, but still want the in-class experience
- Depending on enrollment, is taught as a cohort within a FSL course over 2 years, or can be a stand alone course

New courses

Business Management

- Group 3
- does not get provincial Social Studies credit
- Learn practical business concepts and skills (marketing, finance, operations, HR)
- Assessed via case study analysis and exam.

Film

- Group 6
- Watch, analyze, and create films
- explore roles like director, editor, screenwriter, etc
- Assessment: comparative study, written analysis, film portfolio
- IA: Research and analyze a real business problem

Certificate Courses

- Students who do not want to take the full Diploma Programme can opt for taking single or multiple courses
- It is recommended that Certificate courses are taken as HL when possible in order to have the best chances of receiving first year credit at post secondary institutions

IB vs Provincial Courses

Assessment in IB

- The IB Diploma has a maximum of 45 points - each course is marked on a scale of 1(low) - 7 (high)
- 42 points are determined through the 6 subject area courses and 3 additional points through the Core (TOK and EE)
- Minimum 24 points are needed for the Diploma to be awarded
- Final marks are released in July of Grade 12 after all IB Final Exams are externally marked
- Exams are in May of Gr. 12 year

- GSS top scores = 43 (2021), 42 (2025), 41 (2018, 2020)



Post Secondary and IB

- Universities access IB Diploma marks via the IB secure website.
- IB is recognized in 150+ countries and 2,000 universities worldwide, but admissions policies vary—**conducting your own research is key**.
- Some universities offer scholarships or first-year credit for IB Diploma courses, but rules differ by institution.

Key findings from IB research

- 2022 UBC/UofT study shows that, when compared to Dogwood and French Immersion students, IB students:
 - are more likely to complete their degrees (less likely to drop out of university)
 - have a higher GPA throughout their undergraduate program
 - are more likely to participate in co-op programs
 - are more likely to enter STEM fields

Diverse learners

- Students with IEPs have access to exam accommodations, including:
 - Extra time
 - Use of word processor
 - Access to spell checker
 - Use of four function calculator
- Paperwork (Psych Ed Assessment, IEP, etc) must be submitted to and approved by the IBO.
- In school accommodations are also provided to students with IEPs.

IB Diploma is for everyone

According to a 2012 study of Chicago Public Schools, IB students were 40% more likely to attend and 50% more likely to persist in post-secondary education than similar peers.

The study shows IB successfully serves racially, ethnically, and socioeconomically diverse students, challenging the idea that IB is only for elite or affluent families.

“IB students... describe a confidence in their academic ability rarely seen... They not only felt they could keep up with more advantaged peers—they felt they could eclipse them.” (Working to My Potential, 2012)

IB Fees

- Students enrolled in the full Diploma:
 - \$600 per year (totalling \$1200)
- For students taking Certificate courses only:
 - \$120/ Certificate course (1 time cost of the exams)
- The School District funds the majority of the cost associated with running the Diploma Programme
- For families, the cost for IB can be offset by tuition fees saved at post secondary

Deadlines

- Applications can be submitted anytime before Spring Break.
- Recommended score of 3 on provincial assessments, and teacher recommendation.
- All applications considered.


